# CAN I REGISTER TO VOTE?

- State law requires you to register 30 days prior to the election in which you wish to vote.
- Must be a U.S. citizen.
- Must be at least 17 years and 10 months old on the date your voter registration application is submitted, and at least 18 years of age on Election Day.
- Must not be a convicted felon (you may be eligible to vote if you have completed your sentence, probation, and parole).
- You have not been declared by a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be either totally mentally incapacitated or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote.



# VOTER REGISTRATION FAQS

## ➤ Why should I register to vote?

- ✓ You cannot vote in any election if you are not registered.

## ➤ How do I register to vote and what information do I have to provide?

- ✓ Anyone can pick up a voter registration application.
- ✓ Paper voter registration applications should be mailed or delivered in person to the county voter registrar (FBC Elections). You may contact their office at 281-341-8670.
- ✓ Voter registration can be started/updated at these links: [Voter Registration | Fort Bend County](#) OR [www.VoteTexas.gov](http://www.VoteTexas.gov)
- ✓ You may also register to vote or update voter information at the Texas Department of Public Safety when renewing your driver's license.
- ✓ Some of the basic information required on the voter registration application is the applicants name, date of birth, residence address, Texas Drivers License number or, if the applicant doesn't have a TX DL, then the last four of their Social Security Number or a statement by the applicant that they don't have either of those numbers.

## ➤ Why do I keep getting these voter registration certificates in the mail when I cannot use them as ID at the polls?

- ✓ After the voter registration application is received and approved, a voter registration certificate is mailed to the voter. This certificate is for informational purposes only. It contains, among other things, a section that lists the districts in which you reside. Many years ago, voters could use this certificate as proof of registration to vote, but current Texas law requires that voters present a valid photo ID at the time of voting.



# VOTER REGISTRATION FAQs-Continued

## ➤ **My voter registration certificate expires this year, do I have to reapply?**

- ✓ All voter registration certificates expire on December 31, 2025, and new voter registration certificates will be mailed to every registered voter in December 2025 – no action is needed on the part of the registered voter.

## ➤ **Is my voter registration record public information? Can people tell who I voted for?**

- ✓ Generally speaking, voter registration information is public information, however, there are certain types of information that is considered confidential and does not constitute public information for purposes of Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code. Phone numbers, Driver's License Numbers, and Social Security Numbers are NOT public information. Candidates and campaigns often request lists of registered voters from various jurisdictions, and often request voter history. What this means is that the requestor is asking who is registered in the jurisdiction and in which elections they have voted. There is nothing in any voter's registration record that indicates who a voter voted for in any election, all that shows is that the voter voted. There is nothing on any ballot issued to a voter to connect the ballot to that voter.

# VOTER REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE

## Information on Your Proof of Registration

After you submit your voter registration application, a voter registration certificate (your proof of registration) will be mailed to you within 30 days.

Check your certificate to be sure all information is correct. If there is a mistake, make corrections and return it to the Voter Registrar immediately.

On your registration certificate, you will see a precinct number. Your residence is located in a specific “precinct,” or area within the county where you will vote on Election Day. In some cases, precincts may be combined to accommodate joint local elections, so always consult your County Clerk or Elections Administrator in the days before an election for the address of the polling place where you’re to vote. You may find polling place information here: County Precincts and Polling Place Addresses

When you go to the polls to vote, present one of the seven (7) acceptable forms of photo ID. If you do not possess an acceptable form of photo identification and cannot reasonably obtain one, you may present a supporting form of ID (one of which is your valid voter registration certificate) and execute a Reasonable Impediment Declaration (PDF), noting your reasonable impediment to obtaining an acceptable form of photo identification, stating that the information contained in the declaration is true, that you are the same individual personally appearing at the polling place to sign the declaration, and that you face a reasonable impediment to procuring an acceptable form of photo identification. An election official will match your name to the official list of registered voters. **More information on acceptable forms of ID is on the next slide.**

For voters that applied for and received the permanent exemption from showing a photo ID based on their disability status, this status will be notated on their voter registration certificate. These voters are required to present their voter registration certificate when they go to the polls to vote.

# DO NOT POSSESS AND CANNOT REASONABLY OBTAIN ONE OF THESE PHOTO IDS?

You can still vote. Simply fill out a Reasonable Impediment Declaration and show a copy or original of one of the following approved IDs:

- Certified Domestic Birth Certificate or Court Admissible Birth Document
- Current Utility Bill
- Bank Statement
- Government Check
- Paycheck
- Government document with your name and an address including your Voter Registration Certificate

# VOTER REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE

If you lose your certificate, notify the FBC Voter Registrar in writing to receive a new one.

You will automatically receive a new certificate every two years if you haven't moved from the address at which you are registered.
